#### Note from 2022 (updated July 2024)

#### Tenure of Circuit office holders of the Midland & Oxford Circuit and the Midland Circuit (2001)

Each Leader of the Midland & Oxford Circuit, and now the Midland Circuit, is elected to office by the members of the Circuit. The Leader of the Midland & Oxford Circuit's term of office used to be 4 years but it was reduced to 3 years by the 1997 the Circuit Rules. The Leader has never been eligible for re-election. The Leader usually serves that term. Igor Judge KC (as he then was) served less than a year as he was elevated to the High Court Bench within months of becoming Circuit Leader in 1988. The Circuit Rules have always provided for an extension of the term of office in exceptional circumstances.

The **Deputy Leader** of the Midland & Oxford Circuit was similarly elected to office by the Circuit membership; the term of office being for 4 years. The Deputy Leader was not eligible for re-election. The post was abolished by the 1997 Circuit Rules.

However, after the creation of the Midland Circuit in 2001 the Circuit Rules were again revised to permit the Leader to appoint up to 3 Deputy Leaders. The term of office for each deputy is for the duration of the Leader's tenure and they can each be re-appointed.

# Updated to 18 August 2024

## Circuit Leaders & other Officers (1953 – 2024)

The **Treasurer** of the Midland and Oxford Circuit was appointed by the Circuit Committee. The Treasurer's term of duty was, and remains, for 3 years. The tenure often coincided or overlapped with the Leader. The Circuit Rules have always provided for an extension of the term of office in exceptional circumstances. The Treasurer has always been eligible for re-election. The Treasurer of the Midland Circuit is now appointed by the Circuit Leader.

There has usually been an **Assistant Treasurer** too, as provided for by the Circuit Rules. During the lifetime of the Midland & Oxford Circuit the postholder was appointed by the Circuit Committee. After the Midland Circuit was created in 2001, the Rules provided that the Assistant Treasurer was appointed by the Circuit Leader. The Assistant Treasurer is not ordinarily of not less than 10 years' call.

The term of office of the Oxford Circuit **Junior** was by calendar year; the Midland Circuit Junior (known as the Recorder) was appointed yearly. The term of duty of the Midland & Oxford Circuit Junior used to be for a year from "the first day of the Michaelmas term each year ending on the day next before first day of the next Michaelmas Term". However, for practical purposes the year usually ran from one Grand Night to the next Grand Night (i.e., July – July). Over the years it defaulted back to October – September. The sequence of appointment used to be Birmingham or Nottingham or Leicester > London up until 1992. But the sequencing changed particularly after the creation of the Midland Circuit in 2001.

In June 2020 when the Circuit Rules were again revised, and it was determined that the Junior's year commenced on 1 October each year and ending on 30 September of the following year. The Circuit Rules have always provided for an extension of the term of office in exceptional circumstances.

The term of office of the **Assistant Junior** was, and remains, for a period of one year. The post coincides with the current Junior. The Assistant Junior ordinarily succeeds to the post of Junior in the subsequent year. During the lifetime of the Midland & Oxford Circuit, the Circuit Committee appointed the Assistant Junior. The Circuit Leader now appoints the Assistant Junior. The Assistant Junior is normally under 10 years' call when appointed.

The term of office of the **Circuit Secretary** was, and remains, for a period of 3 years. The appointment was made by the Circuit Committee of the Midland & Oxford Circuit and is now made by the Circuit Leader. The Circuit Secretary should not be less than 7 years' call. The Circuit Secretary has always been eligible for re-election.

In addition, traditionally, the Leader of the Midland & Oxford Circuit had his own Personal Secretary. Over time this role has become that of the Circuit Administrator. The appointment has not been "time limited" at any point.

The Midland and Oxford **Remembrancer** used to be appointed by the Circuit Committee during the lifetime of the Midland & Oxford Circuit for a period of 3 years. The appointment is now made by the Circuit Leader for the same term. The Remembrancer has always been eligible for re-election. The officer holder's knowledge of the Circuit is potentially of enormous help in tracking Circuit material.

# Updated to 18 August 2024

During the time of the Midland & Oxford Circuit **Local Bar Representatives** were appointed for 4 areas (London, Birmingham, Leicester, Nottingham) of the Circuit to hold office for 2 years. Representatives were eligible for re-appointment 4 years after termination of the previous term of service. These rules continue. However, since the creation of the Midland Circuit the revised Rules provide for a further representative for Circuit members with principal Chambers in Northampton and where there are more than 50 members of the Circuit who are not in independent practice they are also entitled to a representative on the Circuit Committee.

The Circuit Rules of the Midland Circuit, as revised in 2020, provide for other officers: -

- Information Technology Secretary
- Chair of the Midland Circuit Women's Forum
- Circuit Young Bar Representative.
